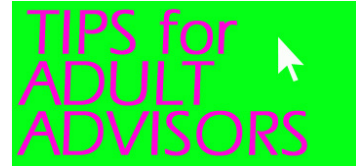


The LEARN, DO, SHARE Model



A Consistent Theme

In all of the feedback we collected, one theme was consistent: When girls created their own Interest Projects, they tended to create the same basic structure for IP activities:

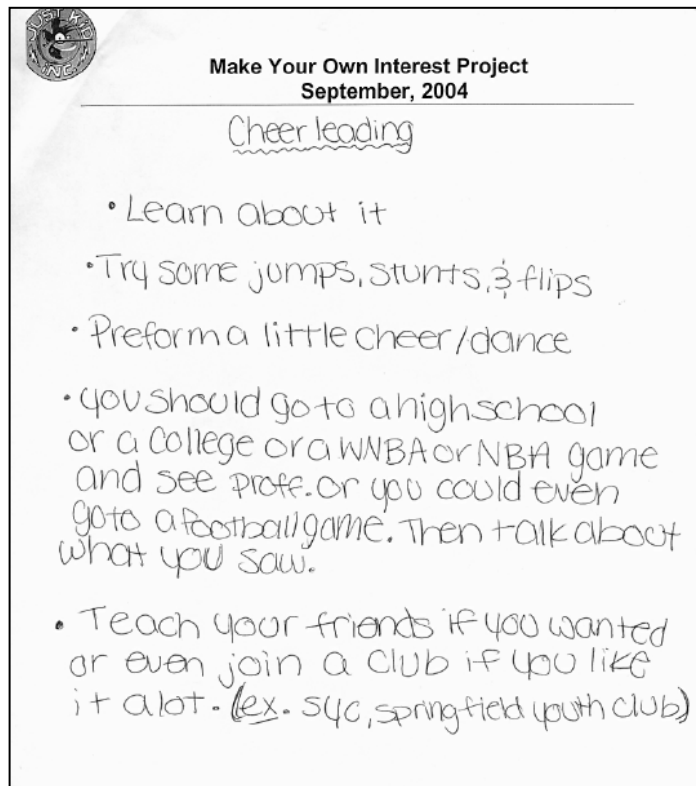
LEARN	DO	SHARE
Gather information and acquire new skills.	Put into action what they learned.	Share their newly-acquired skill with someone else.

Focus Group Feedback

The "Make Your Own Interest Project" shown here was written by a girl during one of the many focus groups Girl Scouts of the USA conducted in 2004. Note her use of the words "learn", "try", and "teach". We have adapted common words like these into the "LEARN, DO, SHARE" paradigm for the new IPs.

What Girls Said

Girls prefer learning a skill as opposed to researching facts (something they already do in school).



They also want to "test" their new skills by doing and sharing them without spending an inordinate amount of time on any one aspect of the project. The "LEARN, DO, SHARE" model addresses all of those needs expressed by girls.
